all were fascinated with the banjo (who isn't!?!?) When the German band heard what state we were from, they sang "Montana Cowboy."

Audiences seemed to enjoy the high lonesome sound from the USA. They made us feel very very welcome and every time we played, they clapped along. Our interpreter definitely caught the bluegrass bug— he may have already started a Nanning Bluegrass Assoc!!



MRBA Winter Monthly Jams


