

Congratulations to MRBA member Ian Fleming on the release of his new CD entitled "Flat-picker". It features 11 tunes that Ian skillfully picks with is wonderfully cleartoned Collings guitar. The tunes range from old instrumental bluegrass standards like Roanoke and The Goldrush...to fiddle tunes like Red Haired Boy, Angeline The Baker/Whiskey Before Breakfast. It also features more modern compositions like Plastic Banana and Dawgola.

Ian is backed up by MRBA member and multi-talented picker, Richie Reinholdt, playing rhythm guitar, bass and rhythm mandolin throughout the recording (except on David Grisman's Dawgola where his mandolin plays a very cool duel

melody with Ian's guitar.). This CD features many flat picking variations on each tune, starting with straight forward melody the first time through and with more complicated variations to follow. The project was recorded at Richie's *animaltown studios* in Missoula. The sound is clear and well balanced.

In summary, this is a fine recording for folks that love good flat picking and for music lovers that would like to support our young Ian for the countless hours of dedication he has paid to the music he loves. Very impressive job!


