Montana Rockies Bluegrass Association Minutes of 2009 Annual Meeting

The Montana Rockies Bluegrass Association annual meeting was held at Ruby's Inn and Convention Center in Missoula, Mt. on Dec. 5th 2009 with Dallas Olson, President presiding.

The agenda was given a once over by Dallas. The date of April 17th, 2010 has been set for our Stevensville Festival. It was announced that many helpers are needed for advertising, someone in each area to distribute flyers for the festival, help at the festival for kitchen, merchandise and admissions. So please pitch in and help.

Dallas stressed using business cards to promote the music association. They are available from Dallas or Lois.

Jan 9, Feb. 13, and Mar.13 are dates for jams in 2010 at Ruby's Inn. Everyone is encouraged to attend.

Dallas suggested the MRBA back the Hardtimes Festival put on by the Conroys. It will be held July 23, 24, and 25.

Forrest Clark was thanked for the work at the campout in Clinton. (Forrest Flats).

New Merchandise has been added: more hats and CD's are now available. A bumper sticker was offered to each member, (one only free).

The minutes and Treasurer's report were given by Lois Jean Malikie Sec/Treas. with a beginning balance of \$2445.00. There was income of \$6243.00 and expenses of \$5409.81 leaving an ending balance of \$3278.19. In addition there is a credit card with \$135.32 remaining which was turned back by Lela Schafer from Merchandise after above figure was printed. A report of where the income came from and where it was spent was also presented by Lois. Breakdown of members both new and renewals was given . Minutes and financial report were approved for the year by members present.

Phyllis Erck described the Web site and told people how to use it. We can access pictures and articles about the MRBA at this site. Thanks were given to Phyllis for all her work.

Greg Boyd talked about the Fiddlers group and there was some discussion about having a roaming festival for the future. He thought we should encourage it. Ben and others said there was a big difference in style of music. No resolution was reached.

Suggestions were made for a couple of music night shows in the area. Ruby's offered the rooms for a show in ballroom or one of the smaller rooms if we wanted to do it. Greg suggested we bring in young players from local groups to do this. Ben will check into this further.

Changes were made to by laws and approved by the members as follows:

Article III section B: The association can be dissolved by the written vote of three fourths of the members attending a general membership meeting after they have received a 30 day notice of such.

Article III section C. All assets of the Association, at the time of dissolution, shall be given to the Idaho Sawtooth Bluegrass Association, (ISBA). Any property of the Association will first be offered for sale, by sealed bid, to the members of the Association. Proceeds from the sale of any property will be given to the ISBA. All of the above is in accordance with Montana Code sections 35-2-720 through 35-2-732.

The club needs a new merchandise manager as Lela Schafer has resigned her position.

Request was made for help for Forrest Clark at Forrest Flats Campout in Clinton.

Officers were elected as follows:

President: Dallas Olson Vice President: Mike Conroy Sec/Treas.: Lois Malikie

Board Members: Greg Boyd, Ken Benson, Tari Conroy and Ben Essary

Ben said he would like to have someone take over the newsletter and it was mentioned that Chad Fadley and Vicki Bodfish may be interested. Ben will check with them.

Meeting adjourned and followed by a pizza supper and jams.

Bluegrass Books





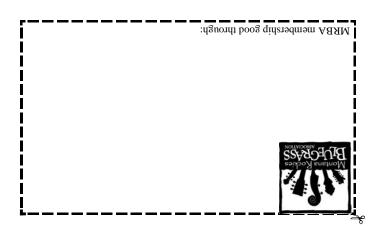
