

Did You Know?

The founder of the American Automobile Association (AAA) was a banjo player? According to the AAA magazine, "Augustus Post was born in Brooklyn in 1873. Raised in affluence, he was noted in high school for his singing and banjo skills." He graduated from Harvard Law School and was a pioneering automobile driver, an airplane pilot, a balloonist, and an accomplished outdoorsman.

Memory Lane

Hee Haw was a television variety show featuring country music and humor in the fictional rural "Kornfield Kounty." It aired on CBS from 1969 to 1971 and then was in syndication from 1971 to 1993.

Bill Monroe and the Bluegrass Boys performed on the hit television show on January 23, 1982 (Season 14, Episode 18). The band performed two songs:

"Rose of Old Kentucky"
"Blue Moon of Kentucky"

Also appearing on that episode was Doc Severinsen of the "Tonight Show with Johnny Carson" fame. Roy Clark and Doc played a tune called "Doc and Roy Blues."


